65/25-26 Public Speaking

(a) Members of the public

A representative of the Neighbourhood Watch attended the meeting, Councillors are invited to attend the first Monday of the month at 8pm in the Village Hall.

A question was asked as to why the bus is stopping on Cartledge Lane and not on Main Road outside the site of the Horns Inn, meaning elderly residents have to cross the busy Main Road.

Resolved: The Parish Council will check the current status of the bus stop and depending on the outcome that bus stop is still in use will contact the bus company with the enquiry as to why it is not being used.

A question was again raised as to why the mobile speed indicator device has not been moved to the site above The Rutland on the Main Road.

Resolved: It was explained that moving the device would cost over £500 per time, therefore the Council are looking to purchase additional devices, but this will take time to raise the funds.

It was also discussed by Councillors that the SID seems to be having very limited effect, with motorists regularly overtaking vehicles travelling at the speed limit in the vicinity of the School.

The written police report includes 8 crimes reported in September – some clarification has been requested on whether the 6 violent crimes against the person represent a threat to the public. Cartref – Works have started on site to comply with the enforcement notice, the timber car port has been taken down. An application for retaining some alterations to the building is anticipated.

Brindwood - Currently no compliance with the Enforcement notice has taken place. The planning officers anticipate that the garage will be demolished, but an application will be made to retain the "leisure building" and that there will be a revocation of a lawful development certificate for the dwelling house known as Sunnyside and its removal from the site.

Resolved: To express dissatisfaction that no compliance with the Enforcement Notice has taken place and to ask NEDDC to take appropriate action to ensure that the Enforcement Notice is complied with and the unauthorized buildings are demolished.
